



- Your child will have opportunities to work in small and large groups




- The school gates open at 8.50am and school starts at 9:00. The school day finishes 3.30pm

- PE Day is swimming on Monday for the first term (swimming kit)







English

Reading: Year 4 will have daily reading sessions that will focus on the following reading skills: retrieval, inference, prediction, vocabulary and book talk. These skills will be taught using a range of quality texts of different genres. In Autumn Term, these books include 'LEON and the Place Between' and 'Rhythm of the Rain'.

Writing: High quality examples of writing will be used to help structure and plan written work. Children will write for different purposes and develop their understanding of the grammatical features required in different text types



We will explore different genres of music through our Charanga scheme. This includes the music of Strauss as well as traditional Egyptian music.

Computing

Using the Purple Mash platform, we will be learning about coding (programming and debugging), spreadsheets and online safety.

This term, our science topics are 'States of Matter' and 'Electricity'. Both these topics will involve regular practical investigation work

Statutory Assessments Multiplication Tables Check

The multiplication tables check (MTC) is statutory for primary schools in the 2023/24 academic year.

The purpose of the MTC is to determine whether pupils can recall their times tables fluently, which is essential for future success in mathematics. It will help schools to identify pupils who have not yet mastered their times tables, so that additional support can be provided.

The MTC will take place between Monday 6 June and Friday 24 June.




