Signing In:

Every visitor coming into Southfields MUST report to the main reception and sign in where you

Behaviour:

What is Safeguarding?

Safeguarding is:

Protecting children from maltreatment;
Preventing the impairment of children's health or development;
Ensuring that children grow up in circumstances consistent with the provision of safe and effective care;
Taking action to enable all children to have the best outcomes.

Disclosure and Barring Service Check (Previously CRB)

All staff and volunteers who work with children at Southfields School are required, and will have an up to date enhanced DBS disclosure. At Southfields we are committed to ensuring the needs of our pupils are safeguarded in a timely manner and appropriately.

What to do if a child says something to you, which gives YOU CAUSE FOR CONCERN?

- Give the child or young person your full attention
- Maintain a calm appearance.
- Don't be afraid of saying the "wrong" thing.
- Reassure the child or young person it is right to tell.
- Accept the child or young person will disclose only what is comfortable and recognise the bravery/strength of the child for talking about something that is difficult.
- Let the child or young person take his or her time.
- Let the child or young person use his or her own words.
- Don't make promises you can't keep.
- Tell the child or young person what you plan to do next.

What to do if a member of staff gives CAUSE FOR CONCERN?

You should report your concerns or allegation of abuse to the Head Teacher Mr Gale



If the concern or allegation of abuse is about the Head Teacher then Mr Dave Nellist - The chair of Governors should be informed without delay.
