Reporting Absences

School Sport. Clubs. & Competitions

In Year 4 PE lessons, we have been bringing the Water Cycle to life using our dance moves. Children have enjoyed turning themselves into ice sculptures (solid), water in rivers and seas (liquid) and water vapour (gas).

Our Year 3&4 Girls' football team played their last tournament of the season and some of the girls got to see the England women's team play against Italy at the CBS Arena. We are so proud of the progress that the team have made from their first match in January, when it was all so new and scary, to a team full of confidence, spirit and energy – well done girls!

We have also had two rowing events and two gymnastics competitions this month. In one of the rowing events, we came 5th out of 14. We are so proud of our Year 3 Gymnasts who have worked really hard to learn their routines and managed to earn 6th place out of 19 schools.

After-school club permission slips for Summer-Term clubs were due last Friday. You will receive a confirmation letter before the Easter break to let you know if your child has a place in a club next term.

Finally, we want to thank every family that has tried to be more active when travelling to and from school during the Sustrans Big Walk and Wheel. We are currently 35th place in the whole country for active journeys. Please continue to do this through the Summer. We will continue to record journeys using the WOW travel tracker. Every child that travels actively at least 3 times a week will receive a badge at the end of the month. We would love to see more children scooting and cycling (with helmets) to school and there will be extra badges for those children.

All children must be picked up by their named adult. No children will be allowed to walk home on their own unless stated on the letter. Please pick up from the school office for Music club. For all other clubs please pick up from the small gate to the playground.


