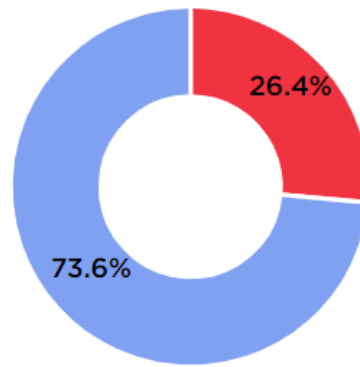

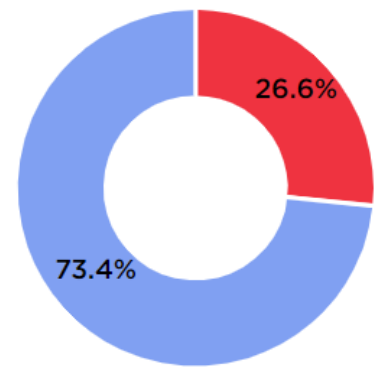

A CLOSER LOOK: WOMEN'S FOOTBALL



In September 2022, VotesforSchools asked if the Lionesses' win at the Euros would create long-lasting change, and over 80% of you voted Yes.

After the tournament, many of the Lionesses were given special awards by the Queen (CBEs and MBEs), and they were on the covers of magazines and newspapers.

The Lionesses have used their voices to make more change. In August 2022, the whole team sent a letter to the Government asking for girls to be given the same chances to play football as boys at school.

Since then, teachers around the UK have said that they have noticed more girls playing football in the playground, and more schools now have girls' or mixed football teams.

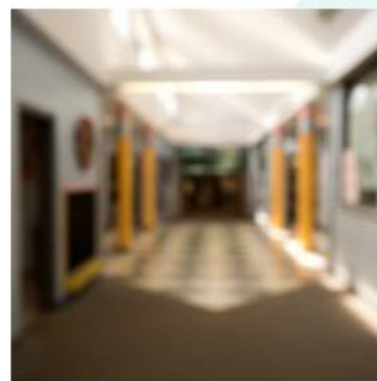

Sewage companies in hot water
